Known Issues

Regressions

There are several regression in Admin Users:

- A CSRF confirmation is requested to see user details
 - Fixed for 5.4
- The confirm button of the CSRF confirmation screen for user edition is broken, preventing users from being edited.
 - Fixed for 5.4
- Batch upload / Users import is broken (nothing happens after confirmation)
 - Fixed for 5.4

A workaround for the last 2 issues is to disable "Protect against CSRF with a ticket" in the admin panel. Be aware that permanently disabling this preference opens security flaws.

False alert when saving some text areas

When saving an Article or a Tracker with a text area, Tiki may display a warning that you may lose data by leaving the page, when you click **Save**.

You can safely ignore this warning and click **OK**. Your edits will be saved.

This behavior will be corrected in Tiki 6.
