

# accesskey

The following access keys are used in TikiWiki:

## Breadcrumbs feature

- numeric 0-9 to navigate to the nth crumb in the breadcrumb trail
- '0' takes you home

## Accesskey smarty output filter

The following output filter automatically causes the appropriate character of each link to be emphasised. This is useful as most browsers (as of mid-2005) do not automatically visually indicate the access key.

Alternative methods of achieving the same effect include using some [client-side javascript](#), or some crude use of CSS3 styles.

    return $matches[1] . $matches[3] . '</a>';
}

...Then just add an "a > span.accesskey" rule to your css. Alternatively, the above code could be incorporated into the outputfilter.urlt.php file, if you use this mod.
